IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for the Ford River Township

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2018 we did not monitor or test for complete metals before our sampling deadline and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do? There is nothing you need to do. This is not an emergency. You do not need to boil water or use an alternative source of water at this time. Even though this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct the situation.

The table below lists the contaminant we did not properly test for, how often we are supposed to sample for this contaminant, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date we will collect follow-up samples.

What happened? What is being done? We inadvertently missed taking a sample within this required sampling period. We are making every effort to assure this does not happen again.

This notice is being sent to you by Ford River Township.

The MDEQ Drinking Water Lab in Lansing failed to run the Complete Metals test on the sample which was submitted by Ford River Water within the specified time. Ford River Water submitted the appropriate Complete Metals sample on 9/24/2018. Ford River Water also sent a Resample on 12/7/2018. The Resample Complete Metals test results were all within the Normal range. All tests ran on Ford River Water in 2018 showed the source to be completely safe.
